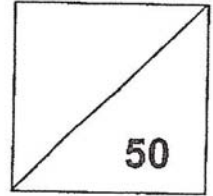

Have you heard of the pandan cake before? A good pandan cake should taste fluffy and moist. The secret to this is to beat the egg whites until they are firm. Also, use only creamy coconut milk.

To bake this cake, you need to prepare pandan juice, cake flour and egg yolks. You will also need a kitchen mixer and an oven. First, mix the ingredients with coconut milk and butter. Then, whisk egg white and sugar in the kitchen mixer. Next, gently pour them into the egg yolk mixture and mix well. Then, bake the batter for forty minutes in the oven. Lastly, leave it to cool before you serve.

Long ago, the Europeans brought in this cake-baking technique. The Asians love the aroma of the pandan leaf very much and added **this** to the cake. It is the combination of East and West cake-making skills and locally grown ingredients that created the famous pandan cake.
