3. Aerobatic flying display by the Army Black Knights

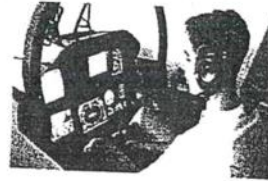

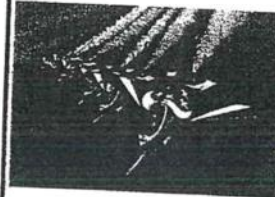
